WHAT WILL YOU DO ON YOUTH TOUR?

DAY 1 | Meet all the Youth Tour participants at the Get Acquainted Banquet and tour the Kansas State Capitol.

DAY 2 | Visit an electric cooperative for a safety and career presentation. Fly to Washington, D.C.

DAY 3 | Visit Old Town Alexandria and attend a professional baseball game.

DAY 4 | Tour the Holocaust Memorial Museum, Arlington National Cemetery, and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Dance with new friends while cruising on the Potomac River.

DAY 5 | Attend the Youth Day Program. Tour Mt. Vernon and the Smithsonian museums. Go on a night tour of the memorials.

DAY 6 | Have breakfast on Capitol Hill with Congressmen and staff. Meet Senators. Visit Iwo Jima Memorial and shop at the Pentagon City Mall.

DAY 7 | Tour the National Archives, Fort McHenry National Monument, Nation Aquarium, and Baltimore Inner Harbor. Attend a theater performance.

DAY 8 | Catch a few more museums. Return to Kansas.
